

Re: Letter to the Editor

Dear Plymouth Residents and Visitors,

On May 26, 2020, the Plymouth Select Board and I discussed, but did not adopt a face covering (mask) ordinance. As part of that conversation, we wanted to reach out to you to discuss the importance of taking precautions to reduce the spread of COVID-19. Chief among these is personal hygiene including hand washing to prevent the spread of this deadly disease. We also want to underscore the importance of wearing a cloth face covering. As outlined by the World Health Organization, the Centers for Disease Control (C.D.C.), the N.H. Department of Health and others, this is one of the key steps in preventing COVID transmission. We would ask all Plymouth Residents and Visitors to wear a face covering when in public, in addition to maintaining social distancing (6'). This would include while shopping in our businesses and while participating in outdoor events where we are in close proximity to one another. As you put the mask on and off, please be sure that your hands are clean, and that you avoid touching your face. The reusable masks (I.E. Cloth) should be washed regularly.

If you are in need of Personal Protective Equipment (P.P.E.) in New Hampshire you may dial 211. The Common Man and the Plymouth Rotary have also teamed up to provide masks for residents. State Liquor Store.

We have done well in New Hampshire in terms of limiting the spread of this virus.
